



Pitingo in concert



Pitingo presents his 'Soulería,' a Spanish-language collection of well-known and historic songs for the first time in Miami.

Sierralta Entertainment and Live Nation present Pitingo, a charismatic singer from Spain whose musical style is a fusion of the high-wrought copla style of flamenco vocals with the smooth musical tropes of soul/R&B. His second album, *Soulería* (2008), a Spanish-language collection of well-known cover songs, propelled him to Top Ten success in his homeland.

Based in Madrid, Pitingo was born Antonio Álvarez Vélez in Ayamonte, Huelva, in 1981. He made his full-length solo album debut in 2006 with *Pitingo con Habichuelas* (2006) in association with Universal Music Spain. The album is a collaboration between Pitingo and the Habichuela family of musicians, the most well-known of whom is Juan Habichuela, a celebrated guitarist from Granada.

On Pitingo's second album, *Soulería* (2008), he collaborated once again with Habichuela as well as another celebrated guitarist, Juan Carmona. A top ten success, the album was a Spanish-language collection of well-known cover songs including Roberta Flack's *Killing Me Softly* and Julio Iglesias' *Gwendolyn*.

He pulled off the same trick with the 2010 follow-up, *Olé & Amén* —half the album was covers of soul classics by the likes of Donna Summer and Stevie Wonder, and the other half straight-up flamenco.

His 2011 release *Malecón Street* featured primarily Cuban-influenced material and saw him further refine his smooth fusion of flamenco and soul-pop, as typified on the promo track *Nosotros*.
