Since the death of Spain's General Franco in 1975, the victims of his 40-year



dictatorship have been awaiting justice for the crimes committed against them and their families. The 1976 "Pact of Forgetting," an amnesty law meant to erase the county's troubled history, did little to bridge the divide between victims and perpetrators, as it absolved both political prisoners and fascist henchmen of any wrongdoing.
