The panelists address the challenges faced by Spanish architects when working in the United States. The understanding of the architect's role in each country influences the process of creation, designing, and execution of an architectural project. What work does an architect do in Spain as opposed to the United States? Is there an intrinsic relationship between art and architecture? How is this relationship translated into the practice of architecture?

Born and raised in Spain, Miguel Quismondo attended the Polytechnic School in Madrid, where he graduated as an architect. He has carried out most of his career in the U.S., first working for a corporate firm (Perkins+Will) and later collaborating with Alberto Campo Baeza in the project and construction of the Olnick Spanu House. Over the past decade he has worked for Olnick Spanu in several fields spanning design, construction and management. Additionally, he had the opportunity to work with many international artists to help them

The architectural space features a two-building campus and is a rationalist structure of 20.000 square feet that will be home to a number of exclusive artworks from the Olnick Spanu collection. Nancy Olnick and Giorgio Spanu have been collecting postwar and contemporary Italian art for the past 30 years. The focus of the collection is to survey artists in depth, with examples of artworks spanning from the 1960s through the 80s and into the present. Since the 90s, the collection has focused on works by Italian conceptual artists linked to the Arte Povera Movement.
