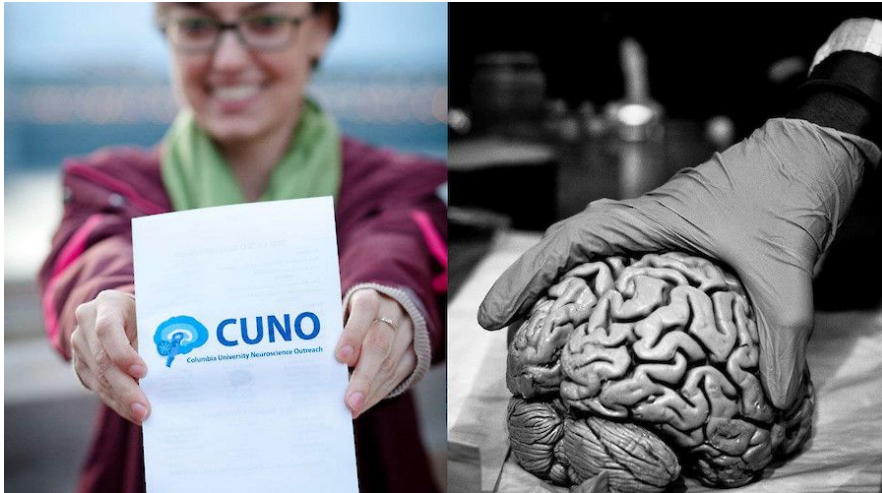




Late Night Science: Science in Spanish
